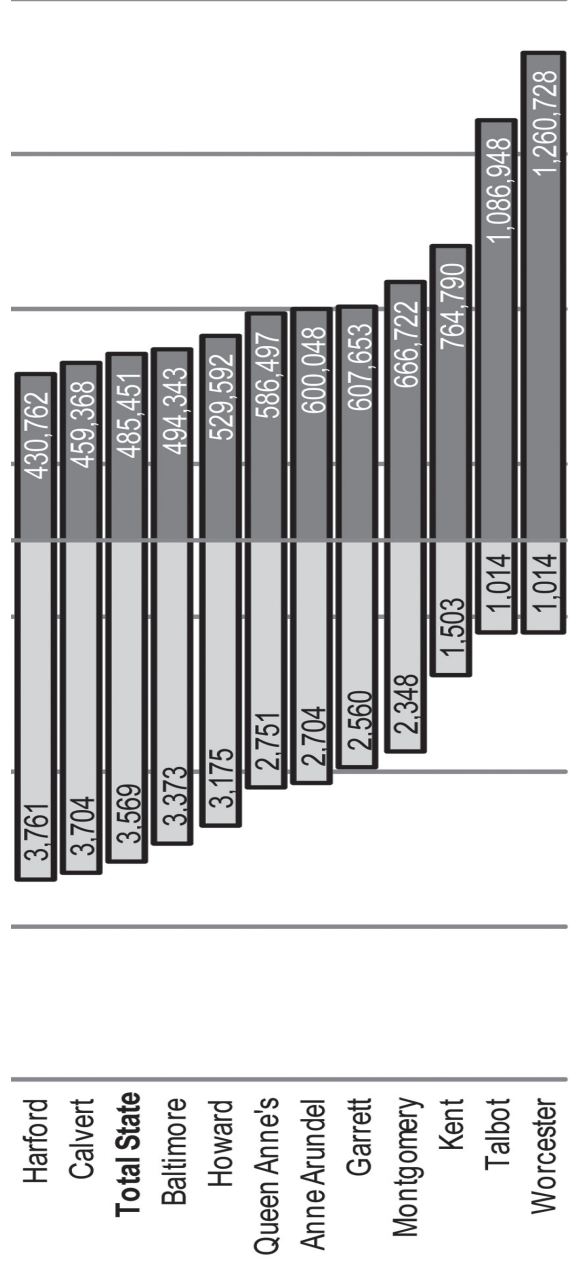
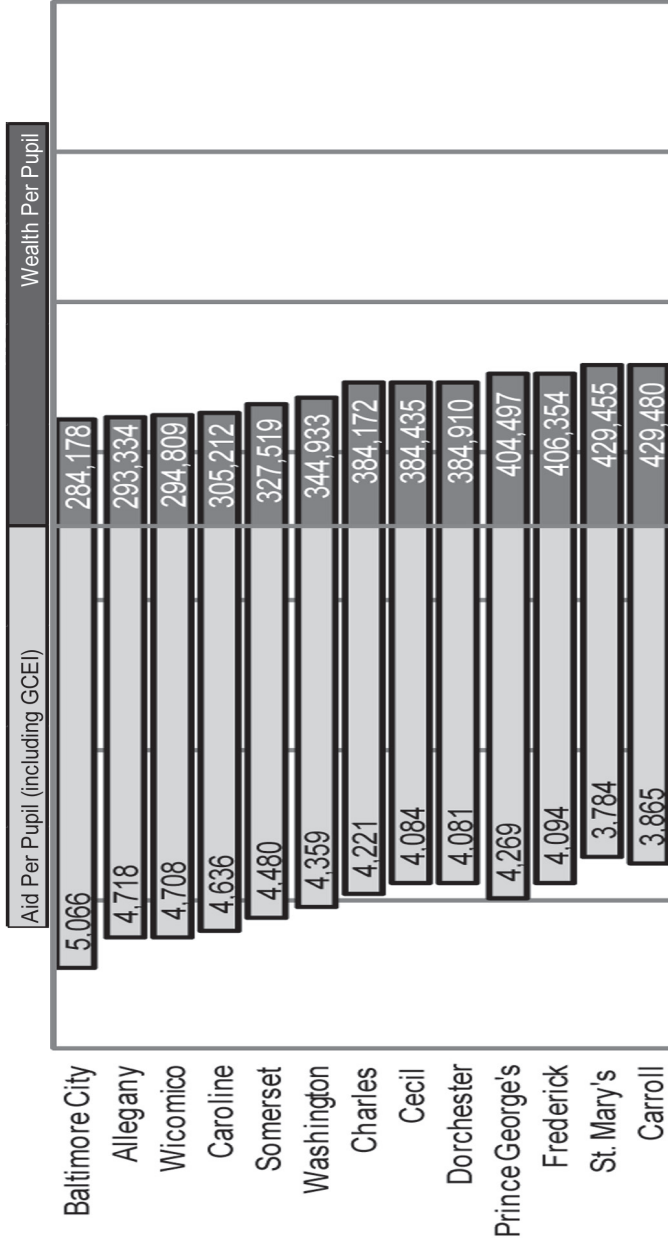
Cost per Pupil Belonging* Maryland Public Schools: FY 2012

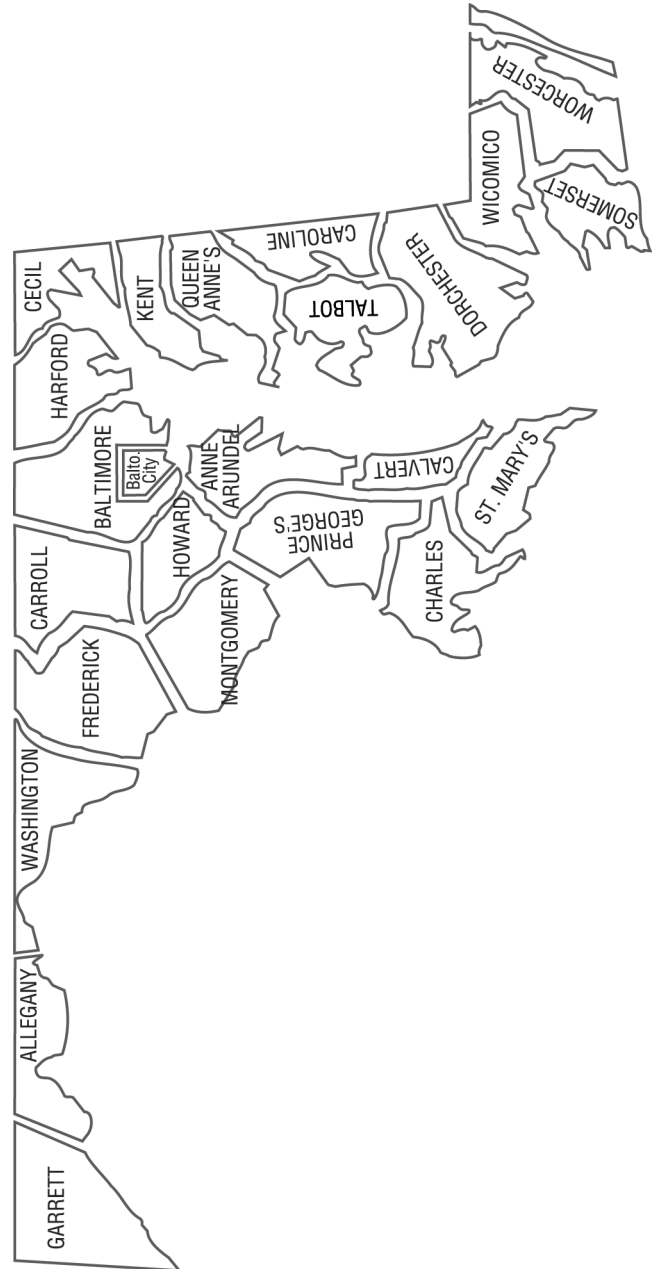
